COMPLAINT FOR PATENT
INFRINGEMENT

JURY DEMAND

Plaintiff Pacific Bioscience Laboratories, Inc. (“PBL”), for its Complaint for Patent Infringement against Defendant Wenzhou Ai Er Electrical Technology Co., Ltd d/b/a CNAIER, (“CNAIER”) hereby alleges, by and through its attorney, on personal knowledge as to its own actions and on information and belief as to the actions of others, as follows:

I. INTRODUCTION

1. Plaintiff PBL dramatically changed the market for skin cleansing products when it introduced its innovative Clarisonic Sonic Skin Cleansing System (the “Clarisonic System”) in 2004. The Clarisonic System employs motion and forces at sonic frequencies to cleanse, soften, and smooth skin.

1 10. On information and belief, Wenzhou Ai Er Electrical Technology Co., Ltd d/b/a
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3 CNAIER is a corporation organized and existing under the laws of China with its principal place
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5 of business at 1#, XiaSong Road, WanQuan Town, PingYang, ZheJiang, China.
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7 11. On information and belief, CNAIER manufactures, markets, and sells electric
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9 skin care devices under the name CNAIER.

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11 **III. JURISDICTION AND VENUE**

12 12. This case arises under the patent laws of the United States, 35 U.S.C. § 101 et seq.

13 13. The Court has subject matter jurisdiction over this case pursuant to 28 U.S.C.
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15 §§ 1331, 1332, and 1338.
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17 14. PBL has its principal place of business in this District, and makes its Clarisonic
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19 devices available for sale in this District.
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21 15. This Court has personal jurisdiction over CNAIER because, on information and
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23 belief, CNAIER has committed and continues to commit the acts violating PBL's intellectual
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25 property described herein within the State of Washington, including in this District, and places
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27 infringing products into the stream of commerce, with the knowledge or understanding that such
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29 products are sold in the State of Washington, including in this District.
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31 16. Venue is proper in this District pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1391(b), (c), and 28
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33 U.S.C. § 1400(b) because, *inter alia*, PBL's principal place of business is within this District and
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35 PBL suffered harm in this District, because a substantial part of the events giving rise to the
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37 claims against CNAIER occurred and are occurring in this District, and because CNAIER
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39 transacts business within this District and offers for sale in this District products that infringe
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41 PBL's intellectual property.
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44 **IV. BACKGROUND**

45 17. Since the early 2000s, PBL has designed, developed, manufactured, marketed,
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47 and sold in the United States (and worldwide) its innovative Clarisonic System, which is a line of
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49 skin care products including a number of Sonic Cleansing Brushes and accessories, the
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1 Clarisonic Opal® Sonic Infusion System, and targeted treatment solutions. Examples of
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3 Clarisonic products are pictured below:
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18. The Clarisonic System was developed by PBL over many years at great expense and effort and represents a breakthrough in devices and methods for treatment of early stage acne and for effective cleansing of skin. Those devices and methods employ motion and forces at sonic frequencies to cleanse, soften, and smooth skin. They alleviate clogged pores and remove debris from skin more gently and effectively than alternative devices or methods, such as manual cleansing.

19. The innovations embodied in the Clarisonic System are protected by numerous United States and foreign intellectual property rights, including rights deriving from patents.

20. Prior to the introduction of the Clarisonic System, there were no sonic facial cleansing devices on the market. Indeed, before development of the Clarisonic System, no market existed for sonic skin care devices. PBL expended considerable resources to create the sonic skin care market and to educate the public regarding facial cleansing, as well as to market its sonic facial cleansing devices.

21. Since its introduction, the Clarisonic System has become widely acclaimed by professionals and consumers, and has garnered many media awards from sources such as authoritative magazines in the beauty industry, Oprah's Favorite Things in 2007 on the Oprah

1 Winfrey Show, Best of Sephora in 2007 and 2008, and QVC Customer Choice in 2008, 2009,
2 and 2010.

4 22. The success of the Clarisonic System has spurred a large number of imitations,
5 such as CNAIER's UltraClear, pictured below.
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30 **V. PBL'S INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS**

31 **A. U.S. Patent No. 7,320,691**

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33 23. U.S. Patent No. 7,320,691 ("the '691 patent") issued on January 22, 2008, and is
34 entitled "Apparatus and Method for Acoustic/Mechanical Treatment of Early Stage Acne." The
35 inventors are Kenneth A. Pilcher, David Giuliani, and Stephen M. Meginniss.
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39 24. A copy of the '691 patent is attached as Exhibit 1.

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41 25. PBL is the exclusive licensee having all substantial rights in and to the '691
42 patent, with the rights to bring enforcement actions for past, present and future infringement and
43 to collect damages for past infringement.
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47 26. The '691 patent has been reexamined pursuant to Reexamination Request Nos.
48 90/009,797 and 90/011,343. The patentability of all of the originally issued claims 1-52 of the
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1 '691 patent was confirmed pursuant to these reexamination requests, and claims 53-64 were
2 added. A reexamination certificate issued on September 20, 2011. *See* Exhibit 1.
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4 27. The '691 patent is valid, enforceable, and currently in full force and effect.
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7 **B. U.S. Patent No. 7,386,906**

8 28. U.S. Patent No. 7,386,906 (“the '906 patent”) issued on June 17, 2008, and is
9 entitled “Oscillating Brushhead Attachment System for a Personal Care Appliance.” The
10 inventors are Dane M. Roth, Stephen M. Meginniss, III, Kenneth A. Pilcher, Richard A. Reishus,
11 and David Giuliani.

13 29. A copy of the '906 patent is attached as Exhibit 2.
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15 30. PBL is the exclusive licensee having all substantial rights in and to the '906
16 patent, with the rights to bring enforcement actions for past, present and future infringement and
17 to collect damages for past infringement.
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19 31. The '906 patent is valid, enforceable, and currently in full force and effect.
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21 **CLAIM I – INFRINGEMENT OF THE '691 PATENT**

22 32. PBL hereby incorporates and realleges Paragraphs 1 - 31 as if fully set forth
23 herein.
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25 33. CNAIER has been and/or is directly infringing one or more claims of the '691
26 patent pursuant to 35 U.S.C. § 271(a), literally or under the doctrine of equivalents, by making,
27 using, offering to sell, and/or selling in the United States and/or importing into the United States,
28 products, devices, or systems that are covered by the '691 patent, including the CNAIER Brush
29 Massager.

31 34. PBL has consistently and continuously marked its products with the '691 patent
32 number pursuant to 35 U.S.C. § 287 and has provided constructive notice of the '691 patent.
33 PBL seeks monetary and all other damages permitted by statute.
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35 35. CNAIER's infringement of the '691 patent has been and will continue to be
36 willful and deliberate, by making, using, offering to sell, and/or selling in the United States
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1 and/or importing into the United States, infringing devices despite that such actions constitute
2 infringement and despite being at least on constructive notice that its actions constitute
3 infringement.
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7 36. CNAIER's infringement of the '691 patent has caused and will continue to cause
8 PBL substantial and irreparable injury, for which PBL is entitled to all of the relief provided by
9 35 U.S.C. §§ 281, 283, 284, and 285, including but not limited to injunctive relief, compensatory
10 damages not less than the amount of a reasonable royalty, interest, costs, enhanced damages, and
11 reasonable attorney's fees, as the court deems just and appropriate.

27 Massager.
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33 39. PBL has consistently and continuously marked its products with the '906 patent
34 number pursuant to 35 U.S.C. § 287 and has provided constructive notice of the '906 patent.

39 40. CNAIER's infringement of the '906 patent has been and will continue to be

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49 41. CNAIER's infringement of the '906 patent has caused and will continue to cause

2 damages not less than the amount of a reasonable royalty, interest, costs, enhanced damages, and
3 reasonable attorney's fees, as the court deems just and appropriate.
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7 **VI. DEMAND FOR JURY TRIAL**

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9 42. Pursuant to Rule 38 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, PBL respectfully
10 requests a trial by jury of all issues properly triable by jury.
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13 **VII. PRAYER FOR RELIEF**

14 WHEREFORE, PBL prays for relief, as follows:

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16 A. A judgment that CNAIER has infringed one or more claims of the '691 patent;
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18 B. A judgment that CNAIER has infringed one or more claims of the '906 patent;
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20 C. An order and judgment preliminarily and permanently enjoining CNAIER and its
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22 officers, directors, agents, servants, employees, affiliates, attorneys, and all others acting in
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24 privity or in concert with them, and their investors, partners, parents, subsidiaries, divisions,
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26 successors, and assigns, from further acts of infringement of PBL's asserted patents;
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28 D. A judgment awarding PBL all damages adequate to compensate for CNAIER's
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30 infringement of PBL's asserted patents, and in no event less than a reasonable royalty for
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32 CNAIER's acts of infringement, including all pre-judgment and post-judgment interest at the
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34 maximum rate permitted by law;
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36 E. A judgment declaring that CNAIER's infringement of the asserted patents has
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38 been willful and deliberate;
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40 F. A judgment awarding PBL all damages, including treble damages, as a result of
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42 CNAIER's willful and deliberate infringement of the asserted patents, pursuant to 35 U.S.C.
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44 § 284, together with pre-judgment and post-judgment interest;
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46 G. A judgment declaring that this case is exceptional and awarding PBL its expenses,
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48 costs, and attorney's fees in accordance with 35 U.S.C. §§ 284 and 285 and Rule 54(d) of the
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50 Federal Rules of Civil Procedure; and
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1 H. Such other and further relief as the Court deems just and proper.
